Dear Parents and Carers.

Firstly, I do hope that you are all well and getting ready to adjust to life under the new tiered system. I am really aware that for some of us, home and/or work circumstances might have changed recently. If this is the case and you require some additional support in any way, please do let us know and we will do our best to help. We can support with such issues as accessing food banks, applying for free-school meals or hardship funds or signposting to mental health or other support services. We are all in this together and we will do whatever we can to help our families.

Last Thursday evening, the St Ralph Sherwin Catholic Multi-Academy Trust held their annual awards event to recognise the work of some of the amazing staff across our 25 schools. I am delighted to announce that Mrs O'Brien was awarded 'Best New Teacher of the Year' (awarded to a teacher within the first 3 years of their career). What a fantastic achievement! I am also pleased to announce that Mrs Young and her pastoral team (Mr Coupland, Miss Davis and Miss Januszewski) were highly commended for 'Team of the Year' and Mrs Young was also highly commended for 'Staff member of the Year – Academic and Pastoral Support'. Finally, Karan O'Connor was highly commended in the 'Governance' category and I was highly commended for 'Leadership and Management'. We are so blessed to have so many wonderful staff working at St George's.

As part of Anti-Bullying week, over the past fornight, we have focussed on creating even more peace and harmony in our school through kind words and actions. Our Anti-Stigma Ambassadors created a wonderful act of worship to help us to understand the part we can play in making St George's a peaceful and bully-free environment. In addition to this, all classes had special RE lessons themed around the anti-bullying message. Well done to everyone involved!

The children have also been busy learning about the Jewish faith. We welcomed Eve (virtually) from the Derby Open Centre to teach us more about her Jewish faith. The children engaged really thoughtfully with the subject and asked lots of interesting questions. Class 7 led us in an assembly all about Judaism to extend the learning that had taken place that week. A big thank you to them!

To prepare us for the season of Lent, on Wednesday we took part in a whole school Advent retreat run by Dan and Emily from 'One Life Music'. Although a little earlier than usual, it was a really fun and meaningful introduction to the start of Advent - when it comes! It also stands us in great stead for our forthcoming Advent liturgy...

Advent Liturgy - Wednesday 2nd December at 9am - Years 1-6

As we approach the season of Advent, the children have been busily preparing an amazing virtual Advent liturgy (filmed in bubbles) for you all to enjoy. We will be emailing you the link to watch on the evening of Tuesday 1st December. Years 2-6 will be playing an active part and the rest of the school will be participating.

Book collection for school fires

From Monday 16th November, we will be placing collection boxes outside our 3 gates (double gates, top gate and single gate onto the KS1 playground) for reading books to be donated to the two schools (St Mary's and Ravensdale Infants). Collection baskets will be out at the start and end of each day for that week.

Maintaining Social Distancing at the end of the school day

As we move into the new tiered system, we continue to require <u>all adults</u> to wear masks (unless medically exempt) during drop off and collection of pupils. Let's also make sure that we continue to:







- Wait in zoned areas when it is your time slot to collect. Waiting in zoned areas in advance of your time slot causes unnecessary congestion on the playground and blocks the sight lines of staff.
- Make sure that if you have collected your first child but have another later slot to collect other siblings, please
 exit the playground and come back in when it is the correct time slot for your next pick up. Again, this will
 reduce congestion further.
- Whilst waiting for classes to come out, please do not allow your children to run around the playground or mix more widely whilst waiting to pick up siblings. They need to stand next to you in the correct zoned area.
- Only wait in the allocated zoned areas (not at tables, benches, by fences etc) as this enables children to be dismissed without meeting children from other bubbles.

Adverse Weather Conditions

Please do send your children to school with hats, gloves, coats and wellies (if possible) so that they can continue to access outdoor learning and play. Some children have been wearing hoodies to school instead of coats but these just are not warm enough. I do not anticipate that we should need to close school due to snowy conditions any time soon, but if this is ever the case, we shall contact you as close to 7am as possible on the day of closure (or earlier if possible) via a text message. Our website will also prominently display this information on our 'ticker' at the top of our homepage. Please do ensure that you have signed up for ParentMail so that you are able to receive such important messages. In snowy/icy weather, we also kindly ask that you do not drive down our road, but park on the estate and walk down.

Winter School Uniform - Appropriate Footwear

In snowy/wet weather, boots may be worn to school but must be changed for school shoes before lessons begin.

Winter PE Kit

Outdoor PE will still take place during the colder months, but children are allowed to wear black plain jogging bottoms and a plain sweatshirt/zip up top in their house colour. They should also wear their house t-shirt underneath. Children will require trainers as well as pumps. Please do ensure all items are labelled. Many thanks!

E-Safety Information - Twitch

What is Twitch?

Twitch is a website where users can watch videos and live streams of other users (known as 'broadcasters'), typically playing computer games. They can also live stream themselves. The minimum age to use it is 13, but it's easy to sign up if you're younger.

What's the problem?

- Live streaming makes it harder to censor what people share or what language they use, so your child could be exposed to bullying content, or content that's inappropriate for their age.
- The chat function means strangers could talk to your child. Twitch is one of the main platforms used to 'groom' children (where an adult builds a relationship with a child to manipulate, exploit and abuse them)

5 steps to help keep you child safe on Twitch

- 1. **Find out what your child is watching** Try watching together at first, or find out what channels they're watching and research them yourself. This will help you see whether what they're watching is age appropriate.
- 2. **Encourage your child to only talk to people they know** Anyone could pretend to be a child or teenager online, so encourage your child not to talk privately to people they don't know in real life. If they do talk to people they don't know, for example in group chats, tell them not to give out information that could identify them, such as their school name or the name of the street you live on.
- 3. **Restrict content in chat** This will make it less likely that your child will see inappropriate content, though no filter is perfect. In browser, start watching a channel, then click the cog icon in the bottom left > under 'My







preferences' click 'Chat filters' > tick 'Enable filtering in chat' > tick the filters you want to enable. On the app, start watching a stream, then tap the video > tap the cog icon at the top right of the video > under 'Chat options' tap 'Enable filtering in chat' > tick 'Enable filtering in chat' > tick the filters you want to enable. These settings will apply to other channels too.

- 4. **Block private messages from strangers** Your child can block private messages (known as 'whispers') from strangers. To do this, go to the 'Privacy' section of the 'Security and privacy' page, and tick to block messages from strangers.
- 5. Make sure your child knows how to report and block people Twitch's community guidelines ban behaviour like threats of violence, hateful conduct and harassment, spam, and sexual content. Knowing how to report or block people breaking these rules will help your child and others stay safe.

Report content from a broadcaster

In the bottom right on the website, below the video player, click the 3-dot icon > click 'Report' > fill in the report form with a description of the issue.

On a mobile, the 3-dot icon is next to the 'Whisper' and 'Friend' buttons on iOS and in the top right corner on Android. Choose 'Report' > select the report reason > type a description in the description field > tap 'Send'.

Report and block users from chat

Click on a user's name in a chat > click the 3 dot icon > 'Report' (or 'Block') > fill in the report form. On mobile, tap on the username > select 'Report' (or 'Block') from the menu > select why you're reporting them > type in a report reason > tap 'Send'. Report and block users from whispers Click the cog button in the top right of the whisper window, and then select the most appropriate option from 'Block user' or 'Report user'.

On mobiles, tap the cog wheel next to the username you want to report or block from inside the whisper screen > select 'Report' or 'Block'. If you're reporting, you can then choose the appropriate reason.

What else can I do?

- Encourage your child to talk to you if someone says something upsetting or hurtful to them, or if they see something they find upsetting.
- Look for signs they may be being bullied online, like being afraid or reluctant to go to school, feeling nervous, losing confidence or becoming distressed and withdrawn, or losing sleep.
- Tell our school about any online bullying your child experiences.

Remote Learning

Earlier this term, we emailed out to you log in information for pupils in relation to the 'Busy Things' and 'Century' online learning platforms. These are our remote learning platforms and will be used when/if children need to self-isolate or in the case of a bubble closure. The 'Busy Things' platform is intended for KS1 pupils and the 'Century' platform is for KS2 pupils. Both are really engaging, fun and provide comprehensive curriculum coverage; whilst allowing work to be submitted to the class teacher. Both platforms can also be used for additional home learning should you wish. Teachers have also posted a fortnight's worth of work on the class pages, if you would rather access learning in another format. They will be posting an additional fortnight's work early next week. We are continuing to monitor which families can access online learning and the survey that went out via ParentMail to ascertain whether families have internet access and suitable devices is still open. If you have not yet completed the survey, please do so at your earliest opportunity.
