Regular testing of people without symptoms is important to help stop the virus spreading and protect your loved ones. If anyone tests positive on a lateral flow test, they should tell school and:

- self-isolate immediately
- get a PCR test to confirm the result
- follow the stay at home guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection

We cannot accept children back into school before the end of an isolation period based on a negative lateral flow test, whether symptomatic or asymptomatic. Only PCR results will be accepted as these are more accurate. Finally, I would like to extend my continued gratitude to you all for adapting so well to our staggered drop off and collection times.

### Being Prepared for any Weather!

The weather at the moment is incredibly changeable! On hot, sunny days, I'd be grateful if you could send your child in with sun cream and a sunhat. Please do apply sun cream before the start of the school day and then children will be given the opportunity to reapply lotion before they go out to lunch. They should bring in their sun cream in a labelled bottle with their name on. To ensure everyone remains well hydrated in the hot weather, I would also be really grateful if you could continue to send your child in with a plastic bottle of water or weak squash. This is so that they can have a drink whenever they need during break, lunchtime and PE lessons. Due to covid, we are unable to allow children to drink from classroom water fountains. Children are most welcome to keep their jumpers and cardigans in their school bags. Should the weather grow cooler, they will then have the option of wearing their jumper/cardigan as appropriate. Finally, it's always wise to send children in with a rain coat, regardless of the temperature, in case we have a sudden downpour!







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## Key Stage 2 Musical Instruments - Insurance

Our KS2 pupils who are learning to play woodwind or string instruments will soon be able to take home their instruments so they can practise at home. Before instruments go home, parents will need to sign to say that the instruments will be looked after while they are at home; all the instruments will be insured by school with a £25 excess paid by parents should an instrument need to be repaired after it has been mishandled. When your KS2 child brings home the permission form, please sign and return as quickly as possible so your child can begin or continue to practise their musical instrument

#### SATs Tests for KS1 and KS2 (Years 2 and 6)

In line with the government announcement, due to the pandemic, SATs for Years 2 and 6 will not be taking place this year but will be replaced by teacher assessment. We shall send the relevant year groups more information on this soon.

### **End of Year Reports**

End of year reports will go out on Friday 9th July. On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> July from 3.30pm, appointments will be available for you to come and discuss your child's report with their class teacher. This is not like the TLCs and is really **only if you need to discuss something specific within the report**. Please speak to your child's class teacher if would like an appointment.

#### Uniform

As it is now Summer term, children should be wearing our summer uniform. For girls, this consists of a blue and white checked dress (not jump suits or culottes), a royal blue cardigan, white socks and black shoes. For boys, this consists of a royal blue, v-neck jumper, royal blue tie, a white shirt, grey trousers or shorts and black shoes.

Please do ensure that all items of uniform are labelled. This is especially important for jumpers and cardigans as children will be taking these off a fair bit in the hot summer weather! Uniform can be purchased from 'Uniform Direct' on Babbington Lane. Uniform can also be obtained via their website at www.uniform-direct.com. Uniform is no longer sold in school.

### Change of Address/Phone Number/Email

If your address, phone number or email address has changed recently, please ensure that you inform the school office via <a href="mailto:admin@stgeorges.derby.sch.uk">admin@stgeorges.derby.sch.uk</a>. This will help us to stay in touch with you.

#### **Remote Learning**

Remote Learning will continue to be in place should households/pupils need to isolate due to their own symptoms or the symptoms of other household members or in case of bubble closure. We only expect this work to be completed if pupils are well. This work is available on MS Teams in the usual way and more guidance can be found on individual class pages. There will always be two weeks' worth of work available at any one time. We will not be able to provide live lessons where individual pupils are isolating as the class teachers will be teaching their classes. However, where a bubble has closed and the staff are well, live lessons will begin.

### City-Wide Transition Day plans - July 2021

All schools across the city are rolling out 3 consecutive days of transition for Year 6 pupils going to secondary schools located within Derby City. At the present time, we are awaiting confirmation from all City secondary schools that this will take place in person. Children in all year groups will spend 3 days in their new classes on the following dates: Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> of July. This should help children to feel more settled and ready for the start of the new academic year. We will also be welcoming our new FS2 pupils into school on these days. More information will be sent out to families closer to the time.

#### **Absence Reporting**

Please make sure you leave a message informing us of a pupil's absence by 9am. If you cannot be contacted by phone, this may lead to a home visit. This is in line with the latest Safeguarding guidance after a recent serious case review in Hackney. If there is no reply during a home visit, we then have a duty to inform the police. We require a daily phone call before 9am for the duration of the absence. We currently have several pupils with compromised immune systems. For this reason, we do need to know immediately should your child suffer from the following illnesses – chicken pox, shingles, flu, measles, sickness and diarrhoea, scarlet fever or 'slapped cheek'. When calling to report your child as absent, the reason for absence must be as specific as possible – e.g. eye infection rather than sick or unwell

## St Ralph Sherwin Hardship Fund

The St Ralph Sherwin Trust, a family of 25 Catholic academies, acknowledges the difficulties faced by many of the families we serve, particularly in light of the adverse effects of the Coronavirus on the community. With this in mind, we are pleased to announce the launch of the Trust Hardship Fund.







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The Hardship Fund is a source of financial help available to all registered full-time students of our academies and intended to help students who are experiencing difficulty through hardship in paying for:

- Curriculum trips, visits, and residential courses
- Uniform, shoes, or sports kit
- Other materials or equipment required for academic studies
- Attendance at seminars, interviews, or work experience placements
- Emergency travel expenses

There is also potential for relieving hardship during recognised Academy holidays by providing access to one free school meal each day for those students.

Students may be eligible to apply for grants from the Hardship Fund if:

- Their household income is less than £25,000 per year
- Their parents are currently claiming other means-tested benefits, including Income Support, Working Tax Credit/Child
  Tax Credit/Income-Based Employment and Support Allowance/Universal Credit...provided the student is not entitled to
  Free School Meals
- At the sole discretion of the Headteacher any student who does not fall under the categories above but considers themselves to be in a state of financial hardship
