Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to you in the midst of a really exciting few weeks in the life of our school. We have had a fun packed 'Healthy fortnight' beginning with an inspirational visit from a freestyle footballer – a real inspiration! Over the past fortnight, the children have taken part in workshops on healthy eating, free style football skills, cricket workshops, dance classes, archery, multi skills sessions and of course Sports Day itself. The children showed great enthusiasm and good sportsmanship throughout. At the time of writing, the event has just concluded moments ago and so I will be sending out details of the winning house and pictures/video from the event early next week via email.

Over the past week, alongside our other 24 Trust schools, we have been considering the importance of how we are 'Stronger Together' and that we should embrace and celebrate our differences. This week, children across the school learned about the Hindu faith, completed lessons on how wonderfully diverse our world is and had an extended singing session. Why a singing session? Because that is what we do best and it brings us together, even when we have to be physically apart due to COVID. The children produced some amazing artwork to support this theme and it really brought us together as a school. Soon, Mrs Young and I will have pleasure of taking a group of Year 5 pupils to visit Derby Theatre to take part in a 'Stronger Together' themed morning led by the Trust. I'm sure it will be a fantastic experience!

We now look forwards to Transition week next week and STEM week on the w/c 12th July. 'STEM' stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The aim for the week is to broaden our children's horizons and to inspire them when thinking about their future career choices. Our theme for this week is 'Conservation of the Environment'. We have a really exciting line up of STEM themed learning opportunities, including; Maths treasure hunts and escape rooms; live lessons about Polar bears and Penguins; Mini-beast nature walks; WWF live lessons on conservation; Robotics workshops; visits from Severn Trent to teach us about water conservation; Reduce, reuse and recycle workshops and a 'Sublime Science' show. A huge thank you to Mrs Archer and Mr Annable for organising such an exciting and valuable week.

As always, classes have been created by making sure that there is an even spread of gender, ability and needs. This is to ensure that all classes are as balanced as possible. Whether your child is in a mixed or single year group, they will be challenged in line with their ability and the curriculum requirements for their year group. In addition to this, we have also asked both parents and children to tell us who they would like to be with next year in addition to anything you would like us to be aware of. We have tried our best to accommodate these requests and ensure that the children are with at least 1 friend in their new class. We are delight to say that we have achieved this for all pupils this year. With all of this in mind, we must stress that the Senior Leadership Team's decision on class lists is final.

This year, for the first time, children in current F2-Y5 will have 5 days in their new classes, beginning on Monday 5th July and running until the end of Friday 9th July. The reasons for this are several. Firstly, from a COVID risk mitigation point of view, this would mean that should a positive case be identified, only 1 bubble would need to close. It reduces risk for both staff and pupils who will not need to cross bubbles at any point. Lastly, we feel that due to the upheaval of the past two academic years, children would benefit from a longer transition period so that they can begin the new school year with confidence.

We therefore ask that families familiarise themselves with the collection and drop off arrangements for their new classes below. These will need to be adhered to from Monday morning (5^{th} July) onwards until the end of transition week (Friday 9^{th} July). Children will therefore begin the week in their new classes and should be dropped off and collected from their new class' drop off and collection points. Things will revert back to the original collection and drop off points from Monday 12^{th} July onwards until the end of term.

COVID 19 Updates/Reminders

Finally, just a few key updates regarding COVID-19 measures in school:

- At drop off and collection times especially, please do not allow your children to mix with children outside their own phase bubble (unless they are siblings) as this undoes the hard work of keeping the bubbles separate in school!
- We cannot accept children back into school before the end of an isolation period based on a negative lateral flow test, whether symptomatic or asymptomatic. Only PCR results will be accepted.
- Parents who are not medically exempt must wear a mask upon entering the school gates.
- If you have forgotten your mask, we will bring your children to the grassed area near the FS2 double gate as soon as the playground is empty of pupils and parents. This is to avoid bubbles crossing over. This will be around 3.25pm, when the playground is empty.
- Please do not be offended if we ask to see proof of medical exemption. We cannot remember all parents who are exempt each day.
- Please do not leave children unattended at the start or end of school day. They should be with you at all times to avoid bubbles crossing over. We have noticed that some pupils are being dropped off early to wait alone. We will be calling these families to kindly request that this does not happen in future for safeguarding reasons. Please remain with your child/ren until the gates open.
- Please continue to wear your masks on the playground and do not remove them when inside our gates. Many thanks.

St Ralph Sherwin Hardship Fund

The St Ralph Sherwin Trust, a family of 25 Catholic academies, acknowledges the difficulties faced by many of the families we serve, particularly in light of the adverse effects of the Coronavirus on the community. With this in mind, we are pleased to announce the launch of the Trust Hardship Fund.

The Hardship Fund is a source of financial help available to all registered full-time students of our academies and intended to help students who are experiencing difficulty through hardship in paying for:

- Curriculum trips, visits, and residential courses
- Uniform, shoes, or sports kit
- Other materials or equipment required for academic studies
- Attendance at seminars, interviews, or work experience placements
- Emergency travel expenses

There is also potential for relieving hardship during recognised Academy holidays by providing access to one free school meal each day for those students.

Students may be eligible to apply for grants from the Hardship Fund if:

- Their household income is less than £25,000 per year
- Their parents are currently claiming other means-tested benefits, including Income Support, Working Tax Credit/Child Tax Credit/Income-Based Employment and Support Allowance/Universal Credit...provided the student is not entitled to Free School Meals
- At the sole discretion of the Headteacher any student who does not fall under the categories above but considers themselves to be in a state of financial hardship
