- The Bible tells of God's love and how people responded to
- The books of the Old Testament tell of the events before the coming of Jesus.
- The books known to Christians as the 'Old Testament' are the Hebrew Scriptures for Jewish people. As a Jew, Jesus would have been familiar with those Scriptures.
- They show how God gradually revealed himself, as he promised to guide them and give them laws to live by.
- The books of the New Testament tell of the birth, life, passion, death and resurrection of Jesus and of how the Church began and grew.
- In the New Testament is the fulfilment of the promises made my God in the Old Testament – God sent his Son, Jesus, to establish a new relationship with his people.
- The Gospels are central in the lives of Christians because Jesus Christ is their centre.
- The Holy Spirit inspired the authors in their writing.
- When Christians read the Bible or listen to readings during Mass, God is truly present and those who hear it come to know and love God.
- Through Scripture, Christians are given strength and courage in their lives, not only to hear the Word of God, but to put it in action in their lives.
- We treat the Holy Scripture with reverence because we believe it is the Word of God.

Key Vocabulary and Definitions	
Bible	'Bible' means 'book'. It is actually a collection of different kinds of books or writings, which we call Holy Scripture. It is God's special book because it is His revelation of himself to us – God's Word.
New Testament	The second part of the Bible (27 books). This is a collection of writings following the death of Jesus, covering his life and teaching, the establishment of the Christian Church, and letters from Church leaders.
Old Testament	The first part of the Bible (46 books). These are texts written before Jesus Christ was born and tell of God's relationship with the ancient Hebrew world and its people.





Prior Knowledge and Skills
