1929	Martin was born in North America

1963	Martin gave his famous "I have a dream" speech to 250,000 people in Washington DC.
1964	Martin won the Nobel Peace Prize
1968	Martin was assassinated

King was a Christian minister and believed everyone was equal and should be treated the same. He believed in non-violent protests.
