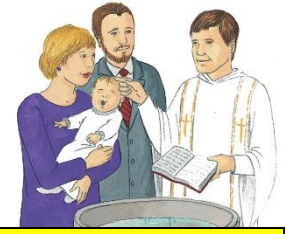

Our Big Question
Are signs and symbols important?

Key Knowledge

I can describe the order of the Rite of Baptism:

- The priest welcomes the child by name.
- **Sign of the Cross** on the child's forehead.
- Listening to the Word of God.
- At the **font**, the priest baptises the child with water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Anointing with the oil of **Chrism**.
- A **white garment** is put around the baby.
- A **baptismal candle** is lit for the baby as a symbol of Jesus from the **Easter Candle**.
- Everyone prays the 'Our Father'.

Key Vocabulary and Definitions

Baptism	A welcome to God's family.
baptismal candle	A Baptismal Candle is lit for the baby by the Godparents.
Easter Candle	A large, white candle representing the light of the risen Christ.
white garment	A white blanket or shawl to show that the baby is now a Christian.
Chrism	A special oil to show that the baby is now a special friend of Jesus.
godparents	An adult who promises to help the baby grow up to know and love Jesus.
font	The container in a church that holds Holy Water.
Sign of the Cross	The sign we make to remind us of what we believe. God gave us his only Son, Jesus, and fills our hearts with the Holy Spirit because he loves us all.
symbols	Symbols mean something important e.g. hug, tears, Sign of the Cross.

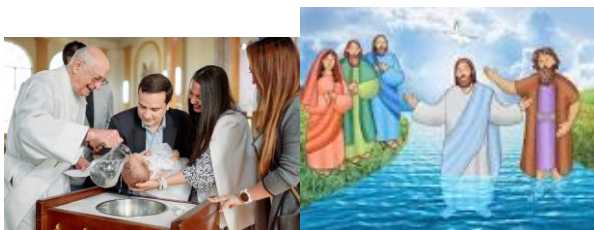
