Welcome!

After Christmas we have a very busy Lent term in Class 7. In this newsletter we have a brief summary of our new learning topics and also a few reminders. In the next stage of our year, we will be consolidating and deepening our learning from last term across all areas of the curriculum, which is in line with our Cognitive Load Theory based approach to learning. This approach provides the best opportunity for children's knowledge to move into their long-term memory, which is the essence of learning, as defined by Ofsted.

PE

Our PE days continue to be Wednesday and Thursday. However, we will occasionally have PE activities outside of these times and so it is essential that you keep your PE kit in school every day.

PE kit consists of blue shorts (and black joggers in winter), your house colour t-shirt, pumps and trainers, you may also have a hooded sweatshirt in your house colour and navy or black jogging bottoms for outdoor PE. We also ask that children have a spare pair of socks in their PE kit. Long hair must be tied back and no jewellery should be worn for PE. Therefore, if you wear earrings, please ensure that they are not worn on PE days.

Homework

Homework will be set on a weekly basis. It will be set on a Monday and collected on the Friday. Each week you will be given spellings (on a Friday), daily reading and a piece of Maths and Literacy/Topic work to complete. All homework is to be completed in pencil or pen if you have a pen licence, in your homework book.

Reading

We will do our best to listen to you read twice a week but pupils will change their own reading books, making sure that the teacher has ticked by their name to confirm books have been returned. We expect that you will read daily at home to an adult. Your parents should sign and date your reading diary to show that they have heard you read. They should also write which page you will be on next and make a comment about your reading if they wish. Here is an example below:

3/01/25 'The Wrong Side of Bed'. I really enjoyed hearing you read, you used some good expression today. P34 next. Mrs Archer

We reward you for each reading diary entry with a house point so make sure a grown up hears you read every day and writes in your

diary! Diaries need to be handed in every Monday so house points can be rewarded.

The Curriculum

Core Subjects

This term in Literacy, you will be learning to read and write; A Spy adventure story, a persuasive advert and a Loosing tale. In Maths you will be using partitioning to add and number lines to subtract; learning number bonds to 10, 100 and 1000; learning about different triangles and calculating area and perimeter; making sure you know your times tables; practising how to divide and multiply and how to solve a range of number and shape problems.

In our Science lessons we will continue to deepen our understanding of Plants; Animals; Materials- Rocks; Light; Forces- magnetism; Electricity; Earth and solar System.

Our RE topics will be 'Journey from Galilee to Jerusalem' and 'Giving All'.

History and Geography

We will be Learning about the Anglo Saxons and Vikings, in History lessons. In Geography we will be developing our map skills as well as exploring rivers and erosion.

As part of our PSHE work, we will be thinking about: Gender Stereotypes, Changing bodies, Grief and sharing online. We will also be continuing to learn French on Monday afternoons.
