



People shared in their communities.</p> <p>Baghdad – EIC settled in a large city community.</p>

(The fruit of the Earth belongs to everyone.)</p> 	<p>The Plague – Eyam – how the whole village sacrificed their own survival for the sake of others.</p>		<p>World War 2 – Solidarity – working together in war towards a common goal.</p> <p>Pearl Harbour – an injustice that saw America enter the war and fight towards the common good.</p>
<p><u>Dignity of work</u></p> <p>Work is important in God's plan for adults and their families, so jobs and pay should be fair.</p> 	<p>Black History Month – MLK - Working for the civil rights of black people to have the same rights at work.</p> <p>Mary Seacole – How she had to work for the right to be treated fairly in her work.</p>	<p>Egyptians and Romans – settled communities in which the citizens had employment.</p> <p>Contrast with those people who the Egyptians and Romans kept as slaves.</p>	<p>Black History Month – Windrush generation - the fight for equality in the workplace and to highlight where there is still injustice.</p> <p>Trade along the Silk Roads.</p>
