





### Advent 2

### Order of Mass

1.	Christians go to a Mass on a Sunday because it is a Holy Day and they want to worship in God.
2.	There are four parts to a celebration of the word; Gather, listen, give thanks and SEND (go forth)
3.	People gather in a Church. Everyone is welcome. We begin with the sign of the cross.
4.	We listen. During Mass, we listen to God's word. The reading ends with, 'The Word of the Lord.' We respond with, 'Thanks be to God.'
5.	A psalm is usually sung.
6.	We then stand to listen to the Gospel reading. The Priest or Deacon ends the reading with, 'The Gospel of the Lord.' The people respond with, 'Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.'
7.	In the Eucharist Prayer, the priest does what Jesus did at the last supper. Catholics remember Jesus' sacrifice during the Eucharist.
8.	The people are sent out at the end to try to live out the messages they have heard and be more like Jesus.

## Upper Juniors - Year 5 and Year 6

### **Creation and Covenant**

8.	Salvation	This begins with Baptism and is the process of being freed from sin. It is made possible through Jesus' life, death and resurrection.

# Creation story – The Fall (Genesis 2 and 3)

1.	Creation of Man (Adam)	The Lord God took some soil and formed a man. He breathed life into him.
2.	Eden	Then the Lord planted a garden in Eden. God put the man he had formed in it.
3.	Growth	God planted all kinds of trees that produced fruit. In the middle of the garden stood the tree that gives knowledge of what is good and bad.
4.	Warning	God told the man not to eat the fruit from the tree of knowledge.
5.	Woman (Eve)	God took one of the man's ribs when he was sleeping and created a companion called woman.
6.	Temptation	The snake tempted Eve to eat the fruit from the tree of knowledge. She ate it and gave some to Adam, who also ate it.
7.	The Fall	When God found out they had eaten the fruit from the tree of knowledge, God ordered them to leave the garden.
8.	Genesis	The Genesis account of Creation and the Fall is not a literal scientific description, but expresses beliefs about God, the world and human
